We research warranties and guarantees diligently because we've come to anticipate breakage and disappointment. When someone recommends something to us, we tend to ask, no matter the company, the claims, or the source, "Can it be true?"

Punxsutawney Phil promised us an early spring. Ha! What a winter we've had. It has reminded many of their childhoods when winter snow was a staple. We hurry to Florida to escape only to find (as we did) that it isn't always warm there either. But they were the only state without snow on the ground, at least twice this winter. "Can it be true?"

My surgeon promised if I had the shoulder replacement surgery I'd feel much better in thirteen weeks, and my pain would be gone. Could it be true? I hadn't had a full night's sleep in over two years. 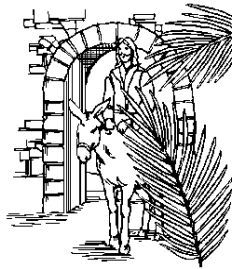

**Ecopalms for  
Palm Sunday**



On Palm Sunday, BCWC will celebrate with “ecopalms” – environmentally sustainable palms from Guatemala and Mexico.

This convergence of religion and ecology is taking root amid heightened environmental awareness. More than 300 million palm fronds are harvested each year for U.S. consumption alone – most of them for Palm Sunday.

“Most Christians wake up on Palm Sunday, look at the beautiful greenery but don’t think about where it’s being grown and whether forests and people are being affected,” Glenn Berg-Moberg, pastor of an 800-member Lutheran church in St. Paul, Minnesota, told the *Duluth News Tribune*.

The effort in America, promoted by the Montreal-based Commission for Environmental Cooperation and the Rainforest Alliance in New York, is aimed at protecting the rain forests in Guatemala and Mexico.

BCWC has joined the movement to buy certified palms from communities using sustainable forestry practices and improve the communities’ profit margins, giving them more incentive to protect the rain forest instead of clear-cutting it.

## **Chester County Food Bank receives \$250,000 from Chester County Commissioners through Community Development Block Grant**

**WEST CHESTER** \_ The Chester County Food Bank received a \$250,000 Community Development Block Grant through the Chester County Commissioners. The money will be used to cover the purchase of the Food Bank's warehouse, offices and commercial kitchen in Downingtown. The purchase of the property allows the food bank to drastically reduce its annual expenses and continue to direct 95 % of all monetary donations to the organization's mission of providing food for those who need it in Chester County.

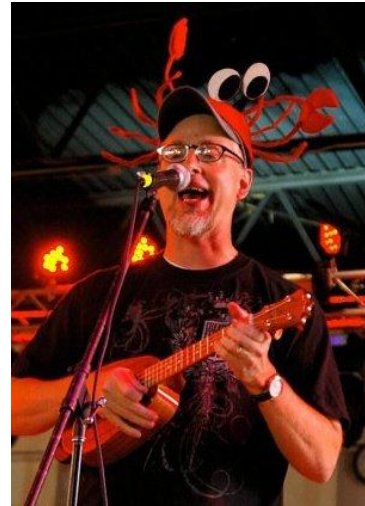
"In the two years that the Chester County Food Bank has been established, the board members, staff and volunteers have created an organization that is incredibly effective in meeting the increasing needs of households in Chester County that don't have enough food," said Commissioner Chair Terence Farrell. Commissioner Kathi Cozzone added, "I am pleased that we can provide these funds to the Food Bank in support of their effort to help families, seniors and children who don't have enough to eat. These funds will eliminate the need to pay rent and allow the staff and volunteers to focus on delivering the help so desperately needed, rather than spending valuable time and resources on operating expenses."

The Food Bank serves 34,000 Chester County households. The number of families served has increased by 2,000 in the past two years. In 2010, 44 farms and 135 raised beds provided fresh produce for the Food Bank - totaling more than 135,000 pounds of produce.

The Food Bank's commercial kitchen helps preserve fresh fruit and vegetables so that they are available to families year-round. Larry Welsch, Food Bank Manager, said, "We are grateful to the Commissioners and to Pat Bokovitz and his staff in Community Development for awarding us this significant grant. We also appreciate the County's on-going support through the Department of Human Services. "The purchase of the warehouse, offices and commercial kitchen means that more Food Bank programs can be financed – including programs where 'people serve people' throughout the county. It will also allow us to focus on supplying food and goods for the 27 food cupboards and 41 meal sites that provide food throughout the county to those who need it."

# Notes from the History Committee

## January 21, 1911 From the Daily Local News Pastor Simpson a Runner.

Rev. Arthur H. Simpson, pastor of the First Baptist Church, who is an active member of the Business Men's Class at the Young Men's Christian Association, enjoys an old-time record as a runner. In Colgate College, Hamilton, N. Y., he was the best runner and jumper. Later, when he preached in Syracuse, all the Baptist churches and the Sunday schools used to hold annual picnics together, and one of the features was the running match in which the pastors and superintendents took part. After the others found that Mr. Simpson could easily outrun them, they used to form a solid line with him behind them, and give him no room to pass as they jogged along toward the goal, and this made much amusement for spectators.

( In 1915, Rev. Simpson left the First Baptist church in West Chester to be the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Pottstown after serving here 8 years.)

## January 26, 1911 From the Daily Local News

For the past twenty or so years, the congregation of the First Baptist Church, this borough, have discussed the question of securing a parsonage for their pastor, with more or less discussion and then things cooled off and no definite action taken, the matter being given some attention during the pastorate of Rev. James Trickett, Rev. Alfred Harris, Rev. Wm. E. Cornwell, Rev. George H. Trapp, Rev. Wm E. Needham, Rev. J. H. Chambers, Rev. Joshua E. Wills, and now lately renewed since the coming to town from Mansfield, Pa., the present pastor, Rev. Arthur H. Simpson, who has moved several times and urgently expressed the desire that the church should have a permanent home for the minister.

### GETTING DOWN TO BUSINESS

Within the past month, the question has again been presented and though there were some who hesitated in the taking of action at this time, a committee was appointed to select a house and to secure best price.

At a special business meeting of the congregation held in the lecture room, last evening, after a short prayer and praise service, the committee on subscriptions reported that over \$1400 have been subscribed, and it is expected that at least \$2000 will soon be obtained for the parsonage.

The committee to select the parsonage made report on the location, the condition, and the price of several dwellings on South High and South Walnut Streets.

### THE PARSONAGE SELECTED

After some discussion of the question as to how the parsonage should be paid for, the manner in which possession should be made, and other things were decided upon, Dr. George Morris Philips offered a resolution that the Trustees of the Church take suitable action to purchase the new house of Herbert C. Smith, No 514 South Walnut street.

It is proposed to use the subscriptions in cash payment on the house, and then borrow the balance needed from the Building and Loan Association, paying off the debt, in the usual way by small monthly payments, while the water rent, taxes, insurance, will amount to about sixty dollars per year.

The argument is advanced that the church will be given a better standing in the community by its owning its parsonage, and it is a great comfort to the pastor to know that a nice home is provided for him and that he is not compelled to move from time to time.

The committee will get busy at once, and it is suggested that the official warming of the new parsonage be made quite a marked affair in the history of the church – a matter long delayed.

### OTHER BUSINESS

Besides the question of the parsonage, two persons came before the church for membership, one being a former member of Windsor Baptist Church, Upper Uwchlan, and the other being a young man, who was recently converted and will be baptized, in the near future.

This evening the Ushers' Union will be the guests of Albert Biles, on North Walnut Street.
